



2004 ANTEATER REGATTA NOTICE OF RACE

December 11-12, 2004

Hosted at Newport Harbor Yacht Club

1. RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the *rules* as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing, including the ISSA procedural rules.
- 1.2 USGG approved PFD's shall be worn at all times by competitors while on the water, other than brief periods while adding or removing clothing. The 'Y' flag will not be flown. This modifies RRS 40 and the preamble to Part 4. All competitors must supply their own PFD's.
- 1.3 Each entered team is required to provide one (1) class legal CFJ.
- 1.4 Each boat is required to display CF numbers and a current year sticker. Boats without valid registration will not be allowed in the rotation and the team supplying the boat will be ineligible to sail.
- 1.5 Each boat is required to use a sail issued by PCISA.

2. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 2.1 The regatta is open to teams which are current members of PCISA.
- 2.2 Competitors must be accompanied by a designated adult chaperone, who may be an advisor, coach or parent.
- 2.3 Each eligible team may enter one varsity team which shall consist of two (2) skippers and two (2) crews and their alternates.
- 2.4 Junior Varsity teams are eligible for entry after being approved by PCISA, and shall consist of two (2) skippers and two (2) crews, and their alternates. Interested JV teams should contact Tim Hogan, (714) 434-4400 for approval.
- 2.5 Completed entry forms and \$60 entry fee payable to NHYC must be filed with Newport Harbor Yacht Club on or before Wednesday, December 8 2004. **Late entries will not be accepted.** * Please refer to the attached document 'Event Information' for other information regarding entry fees.*

4. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Sailing Instructions will be available at Check-in on Saturday, December 11, 2004.

5. FORMAT

- 5.1 Each Fleet Varsity (GOLD) and Jr. Varsity (SILVER), will be divided into two divisions, A and B. Fleet allocation will be done by PCISA.
- 5.2 All races will be sailed in a Round Robin format. The number of races will be based on the number of entrants.

6. COURSE

- 6.1 The racing area will be in the harbor north of the Main Dock of the Newport Harbor Yacht Club.
- 6.2 The course may be any variation of a triangular or other course. Course diagrams will be provided in the Sailing Instructions.

7. SCORING

- 7.1 A minimum of three races for each division will constitute a series.



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- 7.2 The Low-Point Scoring system of Appendix A will apply, except that each boat's score will be the sum of her scores for all races.
- 8. COACHING/SPECTATOR BOATS**
- 8.1 Coach boats and spectator boats will not be provided.
- 8.2 Coach boats and spectator boats will stay off the course at all times, and shall have no contact with any competitor who is *racing* except when rendering assistance under RRS 1.1, or as directed by the Race Committee.
- 8.3 The penalty for failing to comply with these requirements will be dealt with in accordance to the ISSA Procedural Rules.
- 10. TROPHIES**
- Trophies will be awarded the Gold and Silver fleet, skipper and crew placing 1st – 5th in each division, as soon as possible after the last race.
