**NOTICE OF RACE**

**1. RULES**

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*
- 1.2 The prescriptions that may require advance preparation by teams are stated in full below.
  - The ISSA Procedural Rules
  - The Supplemental Rules of the PCISA
- 1.3 Class rules requiring CFJ or Club 420 class membership shall not apply.
- 1.4 All boats must use PCISA/UH/HYSA issued sails and enter in any designated round robin rotation.

**2. ADVERTISING**

- 2.1 Under ISAF Rule 20.3 This is a no advertising event, except that
- 2.2 Under ISAF Rule 20.4.1 ‘...The Organizing Authority or an event has the right to make use of the following spaces according to the following terms: ...’ under this rule boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organizing authority.

**3. ELIGIBILITY, & ENTRY**

- 3.1 The regatta is open as follows: Qualifying Schools from every member District are eligible for this event. A school qualifies when they meet ISSA Rule 1. ELIGIBILITY
- 3.2 Eligible schools may enter by completing the entry form and sending it, together with the required fee, to:

- 3.3 All entries must be received by 1700 hours Monday, October 26<sup>th</sup>, 2009. Exceptions may be made at the discretion of ISSA, PCISA & HYSA.
- 3.4 Liability and medical release forms will be required at the time of registration.
- 3.5 The following restrictions on the number of boats apply. The regatta has boats available for 12 berths each in the Gold (Varsity/Advanced) and Silver (JV/Intermediate Skill) Series (See Section 5.).
- 3.6 Teams unable to compete must notify HYSA as soon as possible so that vacancies may be reallocated.

**4. FEES**

Required fees are as follows:

Entry Fee	\$125.00	(See Entry form)
Charter Fee	\$100.00	(See Entry form)
Damage Deposit	\$250.00	(Separate check, returned at end of regatta per no damage)

**5. GOLD AND SILVER FLEETS**

The regatta will consist of a Gold Fleet and a Silver Fleet.

- 5.1 The Gold Fleet will be for Varsity level sailors with advanced skills competing in FJ's.
- 5.2 The Silver Fleet will be for JV sailors with introductory to intermediate skills competing in 420's.
- 5.3 Each Team will sail one boat and rotate every second race if desired. This is a one division event for both fleets. Thus a team is two sailors (Skipper & Crew) plus alternates if desired. A school may send more than one team in either or both fleets (Gold & Silver).

**6. SCHEDULE**

- 6.2 Inspection Saturday, November 28, 2009 0830 – 0930

- 6.3 Skippers Meeting                      Saturday, November 28, 2009                      0930 – 1000
- 6.4 Dates of & Racing                      Saturday & Sunday November 27-29, 2009
- 6.5 Number of races is expected to be approximately 8-12 races per day, with a minimum of 3 races that must be completed to constitute a series.
- 6.5 The scheduled time for the first race each day is:

First Race	Sat. & Sun., November 28-29	1100
Last Race	Saturday, November 28, 2009	1600
Last Race	Sunday, November 29, 2009	1500

**7. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS**

The Sailing Instructions will be available after 0830 on Saturday, November 28, 2009 at registration.

**8. SCORING**

The regatta will be scored in accordance with ISSA and PCISA Procedural rules.

**9. VENUE**

- 9.1 Attachment 1 shows the directions and map to the Marine Education & Training Center University of Hawaii – Honolulu Community College. The small gray square to the left of the word ‘Boat Parking Lot’ will be the registration area.
- 9.2 Attachment 2 shows a satellite view of the Marine Education & Training Center and boat launch ramp.
- 9.3 Attachment 3 shows chart 19367 with the racing area (Honolulu Harbor “Kalihi Channel” & “Emergency Turning Basin”).

**10. THE COURSES**

Courses will be Windward Leeward variations detailed in an attachment to the Sailing Instructions.

**11. SCORING**

The regatta will be scored in accordance with ISSA and PCISA procedural rules.

**12. SUPPORT BOATS**

Support boats shall be marked with a flag as indicated in the *Sailing Instructions*.

**13. PRIZES**

Prizes will be given as follows at the end of the regatta:

- Gold Series                      1<sup>st</sup> – 3<sup>rd</sup> Places
- Silver Series                      1<sup>st</sup> – 3<sup>rd</sup> Places

**14. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY & MEDICAL RELEASE FORMS**

- 14.1 Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during or after the regatta.
